Set a Goal to Save

If you really want to save some money, it helps to have a goal. A **goal** is something that you can measure and that you can reach by a certain date.

For example, you might decide that you want to save \$25 by the end of summer vacation.

The part you can measure is \$25. The certain date is the last day of summer vacation. Maybe that day is September 2, 2008. (You can use the little chart to the right to track how much you save.)

Now, think about how you will reach that goal. How will you get the money? Will you open a lemonade stand? If so, how much money will you need to spend for supplies such as lemons, water, sugar, and cups (or lemonade mix, water, and cups)?

What other things can you do to earn money? Here are a few ideas to get you started:

- Wash dishes every day
